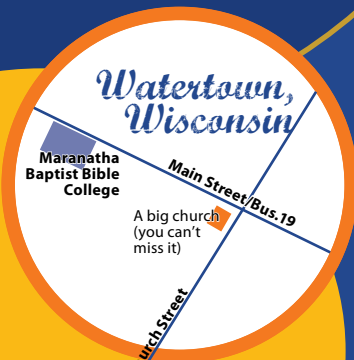

We're delighted you're visiting us! Here's *what to expect* on your visit to Maranatha.

### **Check In:**

The Welcome Center is located just inside the Dining Complex. Meet some friendly people and receive a welcome packet and dorm assignment (plan to arrive before 9 p.m.—after 10 p.m., security staff will help you out).

### **Stuff to Do:**

While on campus, check out some classes and join us for chapel (every day except Wednesday) in the gym at 9:20 a.m. On Wednesdays, you'll enjoy visiting a dorm society meeting. ### **Make a Reservation:**

Call the Welcome Center at 920-206-2370, send an email to [welcome@mbbc.edu](mailto:welcome@mbbc.edu), or make an online reservation at [mbbc.edu/visit](http://mbbc.edu/visit) at least 10 days before you come. Tell us your name, address, phone number, approximate number visiting, and the dates when you would like to visit.

### **Staying Overnight:**

Prospective students 9th grade and above can stay in the residence halls for two nights for free! Those who spend the night will receive up to three free meals while they are on campus!

### **What to Wear:**

Men—Wear slacks and collared shirts for classes and chapel; casual slacks/jeans, collared shirts, sweaters, or sweatshirts are fine for after classes.

Women—Wear dresses or skirts (at least knee length) for classes and chapel. In the evenings, skirts or loose-fitting slacks are fine.

### **Mealtimes:**

On weekdays, meals are served from 6:45 a.m. to 6 p.m., except during chapel. Meal tickets may be purchased at the Welcome Center desk in the Dining Complex (check the website for the latest prices).<sup>\*</sup> Child rates are available for ages 3-9 and may be purchased only in the Dining Complex. If you come for the day, you and your parents will get a free lunch.

*\* Fee applies only to those who are not spending the night in the dorms.*
